Building Community Resilience to Disasters in Upland Areas of Vietnam

Socialist Republic of Vietnam

Lao cai Province: Sa pa district (Trung Chai and Ban Ho communes); Bat Xat district (Phin Ngan and Sang Ma Xao communes); Kon Tum Province: Tu Mo Rong district (Tu Mo Rong and Mang Ry communes)

Aug 2008 – November 2009

Mountainous areas, Minorities, Education

Result 1: Enhanced capacity of provincial, district and commune officials in upland areas to formulate and implement disaster preparedness plans and risk reduction measures that integrate community-identified needs and priorities.

- 1.1 Reinforce skills of CBDRM trainers in Kon Tum and Lao Cai through refresher courses, and accompaniment in conducting HVCA and training in other localities in the same districts.
- 1.2 Design community-friendly materials for use by trainers in visual and simple formats appropriate to ethnic minority areas; engage local trainers in design process for training and awareness raising materials and campaigns to build their training skills and ownership over the process.
- 1.3 Review, updating and simulation of disaster preparedness plans using skills and equipment acquired in the first phase of the project.
- 1.4 Create a hazard map that can be actively updated at commune level to regularly mark where disasters have occurred and identify potentially vulnerable areas.
- 1.5 Design a monitoring tool, including participatory feedback from the community, for commune officials to test the effectiveness of the Early Warning System that was installed in the previous phase and train them in its use.
- 1.6 Monitor, adjust and improve the EWS based on the assessments of strengths and weaknesses.
- 1.7 Design materials, training of trainers, and training on applying EWS and improving community and local government capacity to respond to early warnings.
- 1.8 Extend EWS to test and monitor it in other areas.

Result 2: Improved ability of upland residents to protect health, safety, assets, livelihoods and infrastructure from disaster losses.

- 2.1 Review lessons learned from safer community planning process implemented in the first phase of the project to establish follow-up process for this phase.
- 2.2 Provide EWS pilot communities with training on operation and maintenance and on emergency response procedures using the new system.
- 2.3 Establish participatory monitoring system and simulation exercise for operation and maintenance of emergency equipment acquired in the first phase.

2.4 Conduct participatory planning process to review safer community plans from first phase and identify priorities for risk reduction measures to be implemented in this phase of the project.

2.5 Implement prioritized risk reduction measures at commune and village level, establishing appropriate monitoring and maintenance systems

Result 3: Increased access to information and education about disaster preparedness and risk reduction measures that reflect culture and living environment of upland areas.

3.1 Design community-friendly awareness raising materials, and campaign techniques appropriate to ethnic minority areas with local trainers.

3.2 Assess the most effective means of broadcasting DRR information and a video/radio broadcast with local production companies in each province.

3.3 Consult with select commune leaders, village leaders and village members on how to prepare campaigns on DRR that reflect ethnic minority cultural practices, and values related to communication and social gathering.

3.4 Conduct awareness campaigns on how to reduce risks from different hazards rendering materials visual and appropriate to the ethnic minority cultural context.

3.5 Review status of implementation of government program to integrate disaster preparedness and mitigation curriculum into schools with Department of Education at province level and at district, commune and school level.

3.6 Identify a strategy to support integration of Department of Education in integrating DRR lessons into curriculum and in developing simple, visual materials that can be disseminated in villages through distribution to children.

3.7 Implement and monitor school program

3.8 Collaborate with SCA (Yen Bai)/JANI partners to develop methods for disaster risk reduction education in schools.

3.9 Provincial workshops on experiences with DRR IEC targeting ethnic minority populations in order to promote integration of these activities into provincial programs for education and for disaster preparedness and risk management

Result 4: Documented knowledge on practices for CBDRM and DRR in upland, remote, and ethnically diverse areas contributed to joint efforts for mainstreaming CBDRM and DRR into social economic development strategies.

4.1 Document experience with early warning system and other disaster risk reduction measures piloted in the target areas, including strengths, weaknesses and needs for additional supports from province and national level in order to improve these measures.

4.2 Organize visits from central level to advocate for more comprehensive programming on early warning and risk reduction in mountain areas.

4.3 Regular participation in JANI meetings to share project experiences of implementing CBDRM in upland areas, project progress, and lessons learned.

4.4 Study tour of DANI members to Kon Tum and/or Lao Cai for seminar on CBDRM in mountain areas.

4.5 Participation in media campaign and other events to highlight need for greater understanding and mobilization of resources to address disasters in upland areas.

4.6 Presentation and participation in national workshops on improving CBDRM practices through JANI.

Result 1: *Strengthened mechanisms at all levels in policy and planning to reduce vulnerabilities of children during disasters.*

- 2.5. Develop/Adapt training toolkits and IEC materials on DRR
- 2.6. Conduct BCC training and organize BCC campaigns at community level
- 2.7. Organize study visit for local partner staff and programme staff to Thailand for reflection and sharing on child focused-DRR experiences

Result 3: *Protective environments for children through risk mitigation interventions created*

- 3.1 Commune meetings for Children and adults to suggest and agree together on specific mitigation works which will help to protect children at times of disasters
- 3.2 Implement mitigation works at most vulnerable communes, based on the CBDPPs
- 3.3 Organize consultations with children's groups to get their feedback on relevance and quality of the mitigation works
- 3.4 Support communities, including participation of children, in developing the Operation and Maintenance Regulations for safe spaces and small-scale mitigation works

Result 4: *Children's involvement as local actors in disaster risks reduction planning and implementation promoted*

- 4.1 Conduct workshops with school principals, teachers and education managers on child led disaster risk reduction (CLDRR)
- 4.2 Adapt and produce facilitator's guidelines/handbook on child led disaster risk reduction
- 4.3 Develop/Adapt and produce child-led disaster risks reduction instructional materials for children's clubs
- 4.4 Train teachers to be club facilitators on topics such as CLDRR approaches, participatory planning, BCC skills, first aid, evacuation procedures, etc.
- 4.5 Identify and train child leaders on DRR-related topics to support teacher to facilitate club sessions
- 4.6 Set up and organize regular sessions of children's clubs at schools
- 4.7 Facilitate children's groups to perform risks mapping for the local Community-Based Disaster Preparedness Plans
- 4.8 Organize consultations among children and school authorities for developing recommendations for Community-Based Disaster Preparedness Plans
- 4.9 Support children's groups to conduct BCC activities among their peers in schools and communities

Result 5: *Improved quality, efficiency, and effectiveness of program implementation*

- 5.1 Conduct orientation workshop for project partners at provincial, district and commune levels on project objectives and approaches
- 5.2 Conduct orientation for new partners on DIPECHO and project financial regulations
- 5.3 Conduct a participatory survey at community level to identify the most vulnerable communities for implementing the project
- 5.4 Conduct training on community-based M&E for project team and key local partners
- 5.5 Set up and maintain M&E system for the project with participation of local partners and children
- 5.6 Organize experience sharing workshop among partners, including children
- 5.7 Collaborate with the media and provide journalists with awareness coaching to better advocate and promote child-focused DRR and project results
