





# Quarterly Progress and Performance Report (July 2006 - September 2006) Promise Project Hyderabad

## 1. Project Description and Objective

#### 1.1 Project Description

As the part of PROMISE program, the current project being implemented in Hyderabad, Sindh, concentrates on hydro-meteorological disaster preparedness and mitigation. Focusing flood prone low-laying area of Hyderabad city, the key components of the project are:

- Hazard Mapping and Risk Assessment,
- **Preparedness and Mitigation Planning** (development of City Action Plans and Emergency Response Plan); helping communities and district government to establish a sustainable disaster management strategy and an emergency response plan.
- *Training and Capacity Building* of AKPBSP, District/ Local Government, Disaster Response organizations/agencies, First Responders and communities
- *Community-based Demo projects* in a low laying area in Hyderabad, which is prone to hydro-meteorological disasters. (including community based Local Early Warning Systems),
- Advocacy for Mainstreaming risk management in urban governance (including Public Awareness-raising activities)

Findings will be documented and discussed both at the policy level as well as at the grassroots level through workshops and seminars with government agencies, private sector and civil society organizations and communities. Consultative workshops will be organized with relevant public and private sector agencies and civil society organizations to plan actions for preparedness and mitigations. Networking of the local, national and regional organization working on Disaster Management, Preparedness and Emergency response and planning is also main focus of program.

### 1.2 Project Objectives

1. Adoption of specific hydro-meteorological disaster preparedness and mitigation measures to manage hydro-meteorological disaster risk by stakeholders in Hyderabad, Pakistan.

- 2. Increased stakeholder involvement and further enhancement of strategies, tools and methodologies related to community preparedness and mitigation of hydrometeorological disasters in urban communities.
- 3. Enhanced coordination with USAID Missions to promote sustainability and ensure program activities accord with USAID country and regional strategies
- 4. Strengthen networks and links among relevant risk management institutions/organizations in Hyderabad for improving potential and capacity for application and dissemination of lessons learned.

### 2. Summary of Accomplishments for the Reporting Quarter

After completing the contractual agreement with ADPC in April 2006, the Promise Hyderabad started on ground activities in May 2006. The main achievements of the reporting period (July-September 2006) are:

#### Data Collection for Flood Hazard and Vulnerability Assessment.

- The Assessment report for the recent heavy rains is being prepared. The data of low-lying areas has been collected; the photographs and the movie of the most rain-hit areas have been taken.
- Close liaison with Irrigation department for updates on Floods in river Indus, which was in high floods in the third week of August 2006. The peak flood has passed Hyderabad city safely
- Huge downpour continued in the month of September 2006 in Hyderabad city with the major reading of 130 millimeter inundating most of the low lying areas in target area. Four people died due to electrocution. The photographs and the movie of the most rain-hit areas have been taken.

#### Training and Capacity Building

- Two-days community based 'Basic Training on Disaster Management was held on 30th June and 1st July 2006 successfully. Conducted by two experienced local Resource Persons, with their training background from ADPC, the main topics covered were:
  - An overview of the Disasters and Risks
  - Basic concepts in Disaster Management
  - Understanding Disaster Risk Management Process
  - Community Based Disaster Risk Management
  - Community Risk and Vulnerability Assessment
  - Capacity Assessment
  - Flood Preparedness
  - Mitigation measures for Flooding

The training activity provided the key opportunity for creating linkages with the Community Based Organizations (CBOs) working in the project targeted area, individuals and district government officials. Some of the participants attending the training belong to adjoining districts of Hyderabad like Thatta and Badin (lower Sindh) and boarding arrangement has also been made for them during the course of training.

 Mr. Karimullah Beg, Training Manager, AKPBS,P got training on Community Based Disaster Risk Management in Bangkok scheduled in July. He will be key Resource Person for replication of the Training for Promise Project.

- Organized training on GIS from Sep 5-9, 2006 at Karachi with Mr Falak Nawaz and Mohibuddin Usama as Trainers. 13 staff of AKPBS Pakistan, Focus and Sungi participated. Topics covered:
  - 1. Principles of Mapping
  - 2. Concept of GIS
  - 3. ILWIS Software and Data Capturing
  - 4. Map Referencing
  - 5. Attribute Data Handling
- Following nominations for the training on 'Urban Governance and Risk Management' were made:

It provided important opportunity for clarity on Project Monitoring Plans, reporting needs, Financial reporting, further training and other assistance by ADPC and other relevant information. The important outcome of the meeting was development of PMP.

# 4. Problems Encountered, New Opportunities and Lessons Learned

- Turn over of Project Coordinator created problems and hindered the process as the new Project Coordinator needed some time to settle down and take the things done in time
- The Hazard Mapping and Vulnerability Assessment process took longer due to continuing torrential rains in the city. In emergency situation it was difficult to convene community dialogues and meetings with officials. As well as since most of the time streets were filled with stagnant water therefore the PRA tools could not be applied for quite some time. The assessment process therefore took longer however the entire process is expected to be completed and report generated in the month of October 2006

 Meeting with Professionals of Taluka Muncipal Administration (TMA), NGO representatives were key opportunities for linkages with local government and other stakeholders.
