The private sector, responsible for 70–80 percent of all capital investment in the Asia-Pacific region, heavily influences the society's state of resilience. A unique opportunity now exists for businesses to directly engage with policymakers and to participate in the design and the implementation of the post-2015 framework on disaster risk reduction.

Technical Session 3 aims to highlight the roles, responsibilities and accountability of the private sector in disaster risk management (DRM), and to stimulate recommendations for enhancing business engagement in DRM through effective partnerships.
